Summer Safety Tips

As we approach the summer months, there are things we all should keep in mind when it comes to our precious canine companions.

- Dogs don't sweat like people do so dogs typically cool themselves down by panting. When it's hat, it's harder for dogs to keep cool because they are breathing warm air. Always be aware of signs of heatstroke which include excessive panting, drooling, labored breathing, lethargic behavior and trouble walking or balancing.
- Did you know that the layers of dogs' coats protect them from overheating and sunburn? So please don't shave your dog as a means to keep him/her cool!
- Be aware of the temperature of the ground when you take your dog on a walk. A dog's paws can easily burn so check the temperature of the walking surface by touching it with the back of work hand.
- While we are probably all aware of this, this bears repeating. NEVER leave your dog in the car when it is warm out. Even with the windows partially down, the inside temperature of a car is much warmer than the outside temperature so even if it's just mildly warm outside, the temperature inside can climb quickly to dangerous levels. Keep your pups safe by keeping them at home.
